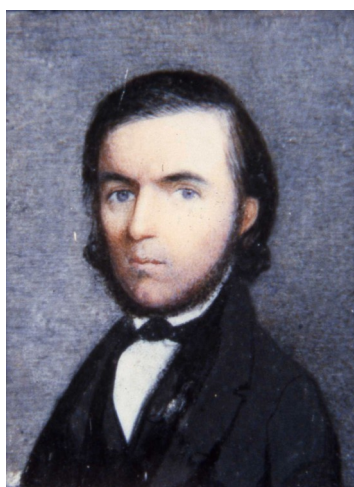

Watercolor on ivory. Miniature portrait of Ann Phillips Trego, who was the wife of Smith Trego (brother to Jonathan). Subject wearing black dress and pearls. Very fine brush strokes.

Water color on ivory portrait of Smith Trego. Smith was the brother of Jonathan Trego. Subject is wearing a black coat and cravat

Artist: Jonathan Trego
Subjects Sara Jane (born 1838) and Anna Marie (1841-1859) are daughters of Smith Trego (artist's brother) and Anna Phillips Trego. Subjects are wearing white dresses with embroidery. Garland of flowers are draped around them and each is holding one end. Frame is curly maple and walnut and probably made by Smith Trego (cabinet maker in Bucks County, PA)



MM2007.05.001

Mid 20th century

Doylestown High School Basketball Uniform made from synthetic maroon fiber. Stitch down pocket and over left breast. Front center has a metal zipper. Cream-colored piping stitched around sleeve hem. Shirt has a pointed collar. Shoulder seam area has cream colored stripe with two rows of maroon braiding. Side seams have open slits. Back of shirt has lettering.



MM2007.12.002

Cockade style fan commemorating the 20th Anniversary of Willow Grove Park (1915). Two side-by-side wooden sticks (independent of one another) act as the handle for the fan. When sticks are separated, the folded paper that is attached (glued) to the outside of each stick is "fanned" out and forms a full circle once the sticks are brought together once more.



MM2008.21.004

Quaker style bonnet in black fabric (19th century). Inside is fully lined in brown cotton and hand quilted in place. Black ribbon tie on left side only. Lace trim around all edges and seams. Bow at nape.



Scratch engraved panbone busk (1820-1860).
Ornamented with geometric designs, bust length portrait of a lady, heart and federal spread eagle.



Doylestown Township School Beanie (1961-1965) made of six triangular panels of alternating blue and gold. Blue printing on one gold panel. Yellow circle sewn at peak where point of triangles come together.



"George School" sweater worn by George Hart (ca. 1932). Heavy machine knit varsity sweater. Crew neck style. Burgundy with maroon letter "G" on white felt backing sewn on front. Ribbed knit at waist and end of sleeves.



MM2010.07.001

Eight day movement Queen Ann style mahogany clock made by Henry Godshalk. Detailed clockface with intricately cast corner spandrels and graceful serpentine hands shows. Working primarily in the 1770s, Godshalk's workshop was located in New Britain Township.



MM2010.13.007

Wooden sign painted off-white with painted black lettering.



MM2010.11.001

Blue and red calico with off-white cotton fringe. Pieced quilt of 49 square blocks (9.5"). Off-white muslin backs with appliqué red design motifs, each motif is unique. Blue calico sashing. All blocks are ink signed with name, location, and date block was signed. Off-white twill tape on outer edge. All hand-stitched. Also referred to as a signature quilt, friendship quilt, album quilt.



MM2011.01.001

Ku Klux Klan Ceremonial Cape (1925). Purple silk satin lined with gold silk satin. Gold silk satin band down the center front and along the hem. Gold silk soutache braid parallel with gold band with a bottom loop on each side of the bottom at the center. Off-white silk satin Mandarin collar with narrow purple silk satin band. Center front hook and eye closure.



MM2011.05.003

Civil Defense Bicycle Messenger Armband. White fabric armband with turned edges. Circular blue badge sewn to center. Badge has white triangle with embroidered red lightning bolt.



MM2011.05.002

Christian Schmitt Honey Can (early 20th century). Cylinder tin can with lid. Lid top has remnants of stickers. Label on one side of can with racist caricature of a young black girl eating pancakes next to a can of honey. On either side of the object are two "flaps" where a swing-type handle would have been attached.
