Virtual Lecture – Beyond the Frame

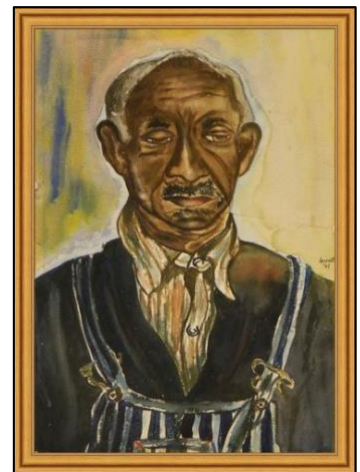
