Also found on the Mercer Museum's property, this sign features a plea to participate in the November 2020 election.

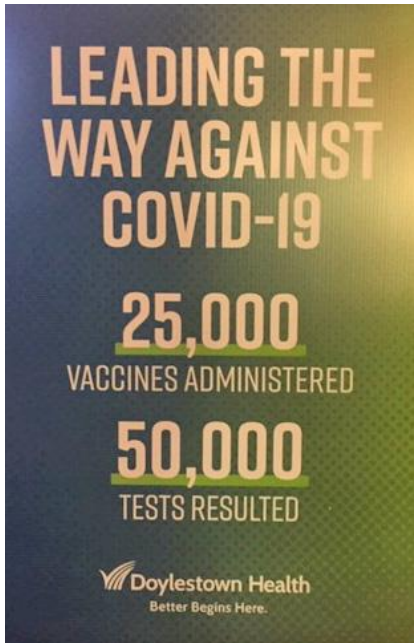

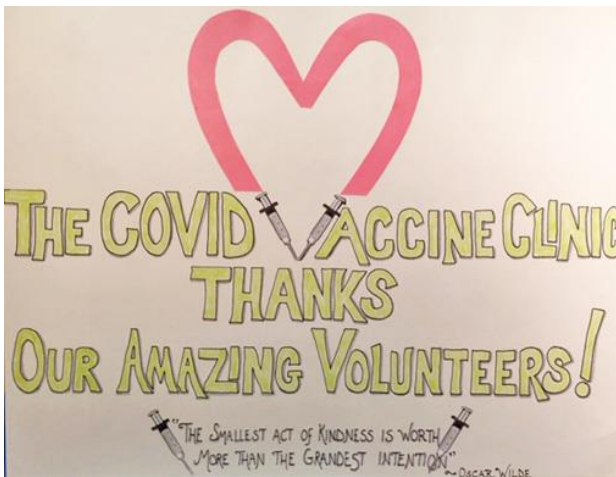
Collected at a "Protect the Vote" Rally at the Bucks County Courthouse, November 4, 2020, one day after the national election.

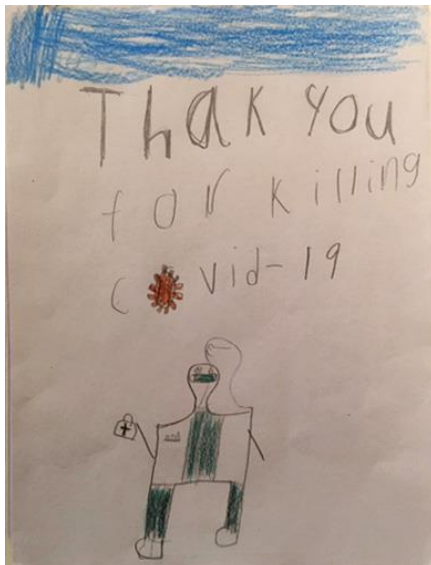

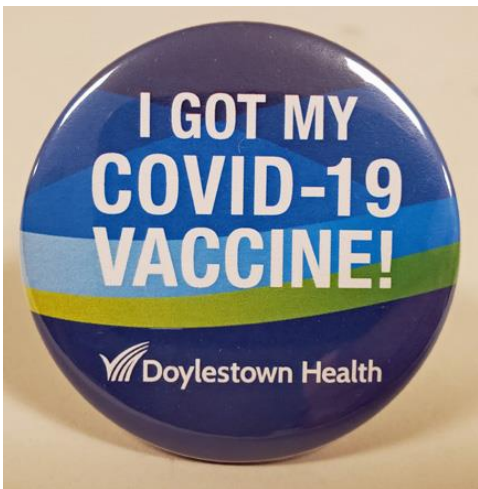

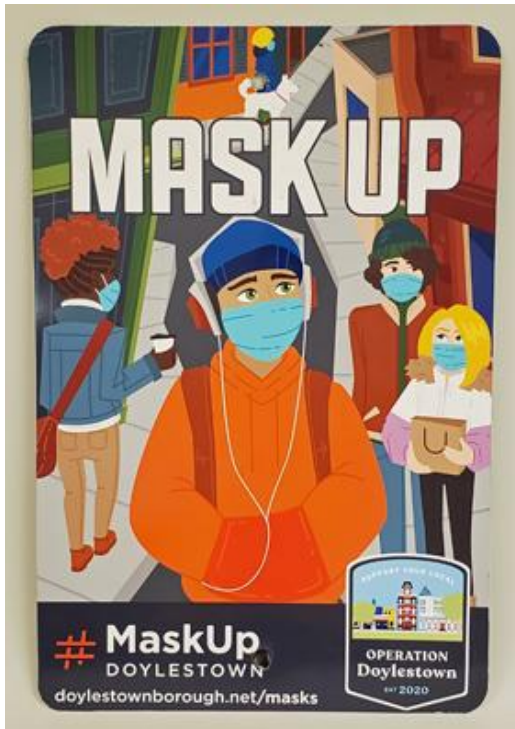
